Call for Nominations: Monrad-Krohn Prize for Neurological Research 2026

The Monrad-Krohn Foundation invites professors of neurology at Nordic universities to nominate candidates for the Monrad-Krohn Prize for Neurological Research 2026.

The prize amounts to **NOK** 65,000 and is awarded for outstanding research in neurology, with particular emphasis on clinical neurology. The award ceremony will take place at the **Annual Meeting of the Norwegian Neurological Association in March 2026**.

Who can nominate?

Nominations may be submitted by professors of neurology at Nordic universities and members of the foundation's scientific committee. Candidates must have demonstrated excellence through scientific work published in recognized international medical journals. Publications must be written in a Scandinavian language or in English.

How to nominate

Subject line: "Nomination – Monrad-Krohn Prize"

Deadline: 15 January 2026

The nomination must include:

- Proposed title for the award
 - A short subject line indicating what the award is for (max 100 characters)
- Justification for the nomination
 - o Max 1 page (standard font size 12, single spacing)
- Summary of the candidate's research career
 - o Short CV, max 1 page
- Key publications
 - o Up to 15 relevant publications, max 3 pages

Multiple candidates may be nominated. All proposals will be reviewed by a scientific committee composed of representatives from the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Oslo and the Norwegian Neurological Association.
